4. Organization

Faculty

Foundation Members of the Doctoral School are members of the Faculty. They decide about the functioning of the school.

5. Studies

Study length is normally eight (8) semesters. In the first four semester possibility in participation in class trainings. One seminar per semester is obligatory. After four semesters there is an examination about history of philosophy and of the own research area (complex examination). The success of the exam is the condition of the continuation and of writing the dissertation. The second stage (5-8 semester) is an independent work with the supervisor.

Students have to collect 240 credits, 30 credits per semester. In the first four semester the obligatory one seminar is worth of 30 credits. In the second part 30 credits per semester is given by the supervisor in the case of continuous work on the dissertation.

Two publications are required for the submission of the doctoral thesis

Complex exam

The exam has two parts. First is the theoretical part, content is topics in history of philosophy and in systematic philosophy which are relevant to the dissertation's subject. The second part is about the individual research work and about the already written chapters of the dissertation.

Submitting the dissertation

The dissertation can be submitted any time with the approval of the supervisor.

Committee

Five members. Head is a professor of PTE. Two evaluator (one is not employee of PTE), further two members. All members have PhD degree, and the majority must be full professor.

Evaluation

1-5 scale, 5 is the best. For being valid the defence, it must reach 66% of the points.

6. Moduls

1.-4. Semester

One seminar per semester, 30 credit per semester, in sum 120 credit.

5.-8. Semester

Writing the dissertation, 30 credit per semester, in sum 120 credit.

Total 240 credit.

The Philosophy of Jacques Derrida

Jacques Derrida (1930-2004) is well known in philosophy for his deconstructive way of reading and writing. Conform to the international Derrida-Research-Programs I would like to raise five topics as possible subjects for a dissertation: 1. *Deconstructing the metaphysics* (Platon, Kant, Hegel, Nietzsche, Heidegger); 2. *Derrida's philosophy of language* (Saussure, Husserl, Austin, Searle); 3. *Derrida's philosophy of art* (Kant, Hegel, Heidegger, new media philosophy); 4. *The ethics of deconstruction* (Kant, Lévinas); 5. *The politics of deconstruction* (justice, democracy, hospitality, sovereignty).

Philosophy and Literary Criticism (Orbán, Jolán)

There is no literary criticism without philosophy and no philosophy without literature. A historical and systematic investigation of this relationship can have a great impact on our understanding of philosophy and literature. Dissertation can be written about the philosophical background, vocabulary, language philosophy of different theoretical schools – positivism, Geisteswissenschaften, formalism, new criticism, structuralism, poststructuralism, deconstruction, hermeneutics, feminism, new historicism, postcolonialism, cultural criticism, media studies -- as well as about the poetics, ethics and politics of different philosophers (Wittgenstein, Heidegger, Gadamer, Derrida, or from the Hungarian literature Babits Mihály, József Attila, Szabó Lőrinc, Kertész Imre, Esterházy Péter).

The research topic, in line with the applied philosophical approach of the school, concerns the study of law conceived as a cultural phenomenon, from the perspective of legal and social philosophy.

It focuses on the assessment of legal and ethical norms that have governed the society and its autonomous communities in distinct historical periods.

A major aspect of this assessment is studying how legal folk traditions shaped the history of legal reasoning and legal culture in the context of European legal modernization. The PhD topic concerns these complex and extensive questions. While studying the relationship between law and culture, it offers an excellent opportunity to apply legal-, ethical- and social philosophical methods to evaluate the legal historical, legal culture historical and legal ethnographical impact of legal tradition.
